## PROGRAM OVERVIEW

### Humanities

Our Humanities courses are a chronological, interdisciplinary study in History and Literature that focuses on primary sources and texts in the Western canon. History and Literature, art, philosophy, theology, civics and economics are woven into the integrated study. Art History and Music History, as well as Worldview and Apologetics are also included.

### Classical and Foreign Language

Our students begin their study of Latin in 3rd grade and all graduates are required to take a year of high school Latin, a year of Greek (Koine), and two years of High School foreign language.

### Logic and Rhetoric

Instruction in Logic begins in 7th grade as students learn to identify fallacies, build proper arguments and think critically. In 10th grade, students then take classes in Rhetoric where they are introduced to the art of persuasive speaking and writing; of which the goals are to teach the truth, to move people to goodness, and to delight people with verbal beauty.

### Junior & Senior Thesis

Junior Thesis provides an opportunity for students to apply the principles of grammar, logic, and rhetoric and practice the skills they have accumulated. As Seniors, students are expected to develop a cogent argument that addresses a topic of public concern, interacts with scholarly sources, and urges a course of action; they are then required to present that argument orally before their peers and faculty. The student must connect this discussion to matters of wisdom and human flourishing.
